Space

Performance Space Required: Minimum 10m x 8m. Outside or in a building with access to enter with a caravan (ea: a barn)

The caravan is rotated 360° during the show.

Surface: A fairly flat area for the caravan. Can be grass or a hard surface.

Audience Space required: Enough room for them to sit on their own blankets/ camping chairs in front of the performance space.

The Caravan

Mardon Mystique 360, 1987, specially adapted with roof platform, crow's nest and opening side.

Length: 15 feet 7 inches/ 4.72 metres (total length including tow bar)

Width: 7 feet / 2.14 metres

Height: 8 feet 2 inches / 2.49 metres (in travel mode) 4m (in show mode)

Access

Min 2.5m wide. Min 2.6 m high. The caravan is light and easy to manoeuvre.

Technically self-sufficient

We have our own sound system and microphones. We power everything from our own rechargeable battery packs. We recharge with solar energy when possible. We do not need access to a power supply.

90 minutes (on average)

Show running time

55 minutes

Get out time

45 minutes


